~40 mill euro for conceptual studies





- Ambition of new call in 2018












- European research infrastructure project



Norway Grants

- In the period 2009-14, the Norway Grants support 61 programmes in 13 countries in Europe.
- The Norway Grants are available to the 13 EU member countries that joined after 2004.
- Under the Norway Grants, Norway has set aside € 804 M for the current funding period.
- 4 high quality CCS projects in Czech Republic funded
