

THE INTERNATIONAL POLAR YEAR CLOSES

The International Polar Year 2007-2008 (IPY), the largest polar research and education venture ever undertaken, formally come to a close at a ceremony in Oslo on Saturday 12 June the final day of the IPY Oslo Science Conference. The IPY sponsors, the International Council for Science (ICSU) and the World Meteorological Organization (WMO), thanked the many thousands of participants who made the IPY a spectacular international success, before passing the baton onto those who will secure the legacy of this important initiative including the Scientific Committee on Antarctic Research (SCAR), the International Arctic Science Committee (IASC) and the WMO Executive Council Panel on Polar Observations, Research and Services. The IPY success story has been captured in a summary report "Understanding Earth's Polar Challenges: International Polar Year 2007-2008" from the ICSU-WMO Joint Committee, which oversaw the implementation of the IPY. SEISMOLOGISTS INDICTED FOR MANSLAUGHTER

Six of Italy's top seismologists are being investigated for manslaughter for not warning the city of L'Aquila about an earthquake that struck on April 6, 2009. The magnitude 6.3 earthquake caused 308 deaths and 1600 injuries, and left more than 65,000 people homeless. On 3 June 2010 the L'Aquila Prosecutor's office indicted the scientists, some of them members of the "Commissione Grandi Rischi" (Commission for High Risks), together with some civil protection officials for manslaughter. The charges are for failing to provide a short term alarm to the population before the earthquake struck. GWP SURVEY ON ECOSYSTEM SERVICES

The Global Water Partnership (GWP) (<http://www.gwpforum.org/>) is conducting a survey for those who are, in one way or another, involved in or study a scheme, that rewards ecosystem services (such as watershed protection, biodiversity protection or carbon sequestration). Fair, effective and efficient benefit-sharing schemes to the providers of the ecosystem services are essential if biocarbon is to significantly contribute to climate change mitigation. Next to the positive effect on mitigation, important benefits for poverty reduction, livelihood improvement and climate change adaptation can be expected for successful approaches. However, information about successful benefit sharing schemes is scarce (particularly for carbon projects), and the experiences from the few projects that are ongoing are not available in a structured way. This survey attempts to close some of the information gaps in order to see which lessons can be learned so far, where the main challenges lie and what can be done to develop appropriate benefit sharing for carbon sequestration schemes in the future. The results of this survey will have considerable policy relevance and will be presented at the appropriate fora (e.g. United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change - UNFCCC COP). As outlined in detail in IUGS E-bulletin No. 52 The International Geoscience Programme (IGCP) - formerly International Geological Correlation Programme - a joint endeavour between the IUGS (International Union of Geological Sciences) and UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) has issued its 2010 call for new project proposals. IGCP projects are approved for a period not exceeding five years. Individual projects are reviewed annually after the second year and may be terminated if performing poorly as identified during a review.
