This large and prestigious Geoscience World Congress will be held in Brisbane, Australia, from 5-10 August 2012. The scientific program will cover all aspects of the geosciences. It will demonstrate how geoscience knowledge and applications are contributing directly to meeting societal needs, for example through innovation in the resources and energy based industries, better informed land and water management, enhanced understanding and mitigation of climate change and geohazards, and building major cities and infrastructure. All geoscience groups are invited to consider integrating their 2012 meetings into the 34th IGC, to benefit from the opportunities it offers for synergies and networking. There will be about 40 pre and post Congress field trips offered, and a major exhibition. The GeoHost support program for delegates from low income nations will be linked to participation in training workshops. The 34th IGC will feature a major Theme dedicated to geoscience benefiting low income nations.

The IGC Organising Committee seeks all feedback on the Draft program, including any proposed Symposia you would like to nominate, input to proposed Symposia, and also any volunteer Co-ordinators for proposed Symposia. REPORT ON THE GLOBAL MEETING "TECTONIC CROSS ROADS: EVOLVING OROGENS OF EURASIA-AFRICA-ARABIA" (ANKARA, TURKEY, 4-8 OCTOBER 2010).

This meeting was held at the Cultural and Convention Centre of the Middle East Technical University, under the sponsorship of the Geological Society of America, the Chamber of the Geological Engineers of Turkey, and the Turkish Association of Petroleum Geologists. Partners included the IGCP and the IUGS, both partners were represented by the IUGS President. The purpose of the meeting was to provide a forum for international earth scientists to exchange and discuss their recent observations and interpretations on the crustal structure, mantle dynamics, and landscape development of evolving orogens around the world, with an emphasis on the eastern Mediterranean region. Oral and poster sessions were devoted to different topics, among them: Ophiolites, blueschists and suture zones; Magmatism in evolving orogens: Collision to extension; Mélanges and mélange-forming processes; Aegean geodynamics and extensional tectonics; Crustal motions, mantle dynamics and GPS velocities in continental collision; Strike-slip and transform fault tectonics; Seismicity, palaeoseismicity and archaeoseismology of the Mediterranean region; Sedimentary basin evolution and oil fields in the Middle and Near East. The number of presentations approached 300 and involved more than 600 contributors. Field trips were devoted to the active faulting and archaeoseismology of Western Anatolia; and blueschists, ophiolites and suture zones in Northwest Anatolia. More information at:

BELMONT CHALLENGE REPORT NOW AVAILABLE

In June 2009, the US National Science Foundation (NSF) and the UK Natural Environment Research Council (NERC) led a meeting in Belmont, Washington DC, attended by representatives of several of the world's major global change research funding agencies and the International Council for Science (ICSU). These agencies, supporting basic and applied research in Earth system science, identified a challenge for the international scientific community to develop and deliver knowledge in support of national and international government action to mitigate and adapt to global and regional environmental change with an emphasis on regional hazards. The address this task, ICSU set up a high-level panel consisting of 15 international experts.
