GEOENGINEERING: THE WAY FORWARD FOR REDUCING CLIMATE CHANGE?

On 12 November 2010, UNESCO convened an international expert meeting on Geoengineering science and associated governance issues at its Paris Headquarters. Geoengineering is a response to the need to reduce climate change, and is the intentional, large-scale alteration of the climate system. The meeting was the first to use UNESCO's 'honest broker' role to create a forum for international discussion and create awareness of the science and governance of this rapidly evolving field. The invited experts included 20 participants from a dozen countries and various academic, non profit, governmental and intergovernmental institutions.

The recommendations of the meeting were that geoengineering be considered in two categories:

* Solar Geoengineering which refers to interventions that reduce the amount of solar radiation absorbed by the Earth's climate system, such as the injection of reflective particles like sulphur dioxide into the lower or upper atmosphere, resulting in lower global average temperatures; and

* Carbon Geoengineering which refers to the active removal of carbon dioxide from the atmosphere through engineered CO2 scrubbers, or the enhancement of ecosystem processes, and results in a reduction of the detrimental impacts caused by the build-up of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere.

An additional recommendation of the meeting was the creation of an international research programme similar to the World Climate Research Programme (WCRP) sponsored by the International Council for Science (ICSU), the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) and the Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission (IOC) and UNESCO.

The new programme could address the technological and scientific challenges of geoengineering and ensure that legitimate scientific research into this controversial issue may proceed. This recognizes the statement of the Convention on Biological Diversity, at its recent meeting in Nagoya, Japan, allowing for small-scale geoengineering research experiments as long as a number of controls are in place.

GEOETHICS AT GEOITALIA 2011

GeoItalia 2011 - The VIII Forum of the Italian Federation of Earth Sciences (FIST), will be held September 19-23, 2011, in Turin, Italy. The theme is "Earth Science for Sustainable Development" (see:

http://www.geoitalia.org/index.php?action=folder_list&folder_id=214). The Congress will host a special Geoethics session in which topics to be discussed include: Comparison between the global geological-geoethical problems; Rational and sustainable use of geo-resources; Proper means for dissemination of results of scientific studies and responsible; Public information on the risks ; Improving relations between the scientific community, mass media and the public; Getting support of policy decisions; Organization of effective teaching tools to develop awareness, values and responsibilities; Transfer of the cultural value of the environment to those who inhabit it; Promotion of working groups within the university and professional associations, for developing GeoEthical practices for internal and external communications. At the Forum a Committee on Geoethics - created inside the FIST (Federazione Italiana di Scienze della Terra - Italian Federation of Earth Sciences) - will propose the introduction of an "Oath for Geoscientists", similar to the 'Hippocratic Oath' for doctors, which will require every new geologist to take solemnly at the Convocation Ceremony of getting the degree in Geoscience. RECENT INFORMATION ON PUBLICATIONS, JOURNALS AND NEWSLETTERS

The International Fertilizer Industry Association (IFA) has produced a Fertilizer Glossary that is now available on-line in five languages: English, French, German, Spanish and Chinese. Revisions have been made since 1980 by groups of experts brought together in the IFA Agricultural Committee. There are more than 150 terms and expressions related to fertilizer use, soil science, fertilizer manufacture and analysis, and application machinery and methods. The glossary is organized in five sections, one for each language. Terms are listed in alphabetical order with brief definitions. In some cases there is no equivalent term in other languages, which explains the unequal number of entries in different sections. The nearest equivalent terms may differ from one language to another.
